SCHOOL SUPPLIES	Students should prepare for summer school classes similar to how they prepare for the regular school year classes. Teachers will inform students of any unique exceptions during the first few days of class.  NOTE: Please remember to bring your district-issued Chromebook fully charged and ready for use, each day.	
BUSSING	All students who are registered through the CNUSD transportation office will continue to receive transportation services during summer school. For any questions, please contact the transportation department at <u>951-736-8233</u> for pricing details and bus route information.	
STUDENT DROP OFF/PICK-UP - CAMPUS OPENS @8:00 am	Please review the attached map regarding entry and exit points for traffic during student drop-off and pick-up. Please plan accordingly and allow yourself enough time to arrive, scan your student ID through security, and report to class before the tardy bell. <b>NOTE</b> : Please review the attendance section below.  NOTE: Please remember, for obvious safety reasons, students should never be dropped off by stopping along the curb/sidewalk on Rimpau Avenue.	
ATTENDANCE	Students may miss up to 6 hours of class but one minute more (such as a tardy) will result in dropping the student from the course. Tardy 1-15 min=15 min absence, tardy 16-30 min=30 min absence, tardy 31-45 min=45 min absence, tardy 46-60 min=60 min absence.	
DRESS CODE POLICY	The Corona-Norco Unified School District's Board of Education is legally and ethically responsible for the establishment of classroom and campus environments that are conducive to an orderly and productive educational program. Therefore, the CNUSD Board Dress Policy will continue to be applied at Centennial High School during the Summer School season.	
BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS	To ensure an enjoyable, engaging, and appropriate environment for teaching and learning, all students are expected to abide by all school and district behavior policies in accordance with California and federal ed codes. Students who are sent to the admin office for disciplinary reasons will have minutes deducted from their class attendance and may be awarded consequences ranging from disenrollment from the Summer School program, suspension, expulsions, and more.	
Cell Phone/ Electronics Use Policy	The use of ALL electronic devices in the classroom is managed at the teacher's discretion. All earbuds/headphones, etc. should be powered down and stored during instructional time. Cell phones, smartwatches, and other electronic devices may only be used when permitted by the teacher. Students who choose not to cooperate with classroom electronic use policies may have their cell phone or device confiscated and turned into the admin office. All student electronic devices/belongings turned into the admin office may require a parent's signature to be returned to the student after the school day. <b>NOTE</b> : The admin office closes daily at 3:50 pm.	

STUDENT PARKING	During the brief summer school session, students are allowed to park in the standard Centennial student parking lot without a parking permit. Please remember, if safety concerns or circumstances arise, all vehicles parked on any public-school campus are subject to search.		
TEXTBOOKS	Students will acquire their required textbooks while with their respective classes, during the first few days of each session. NOTE: Students will be expected to return their textbooks after each summer school session in the same condition they were issued. Lost/stolen textbooks will accrue obligations in the same way they do during the regular school year.		
DISTRICT-ISSUED CHROMEBOOK	Please remember to bring your district-issued Chromebook fully charged and ready for use, every day. The school will not be issuing "loaner" devices during the school day. Students may acquire help with troubleshooting devices by reporting to the admin office before school, or during lunch.		
BREAKFAST/LUNCH 8:10 AM/11:50 AM MON-FRI	The cafeteria at each summer school site will be providing breakfast and lunch at no cost. Sample menu items include: Miguel's burritos, pizza, and a cold turkey wrap. <b>All meals are free of charge.</b> High school students may also leave campus to get lunch, but due to the limited time (30 minutes), it is not recommended. No outside food/drink will be permitted on campus. For safety reasons, no food deliveries or drop-offs will be permitted before school or during the school day, including lunchtime.		
FOOD & SNACKS	To reduce disruptions to instructional time, and to ensure students are in class and successfully engaged in their learning experience, students will not have access to vending machines during class time. Therefore, for convenience and comfort, students are encouraged to pack non-perishable snacks and water for consumption during class breaks, lunchtime, and after school. Food and beverage consumption will not be permitted in the classroom.; with the exception of bottled water.
