August

October

- Begin researching possible colleges you are considering.
- Attend the Financial Aid Night at Santiago High School on Oct. 14th, 2020, 4:00 pm-6:00 pm online.
- Consider taking an SAT/ACT Prep course to help prepare for an upcoming test. Utilize the free website www.khanacademy.org.

December

- Start planning to take the SAT (www.collegeboard.org) and/or ACT (www.ACT.org) exams. Plan to take the SAT subject test, if necessary.

January

- Go online to research three to five colleges that interest you the most (www.californiacolleges.edu)

February

March

- Register and study for the SAT and/or ACT exams. The Subject test may be required please check your intended school.

April

- Contact the university school website and begin scheduling visits to each of the universities that you are seriously considering. (www.californiacolleges.edu)
- Prepare and register for AP exams next month in the Shark Shop.

May

- Take the SAT and/or ACT exams.
- Take the AP exams.
- Begin preparing essays for college admission and scholarships applications.
- Create a resume, including your accomplishments, activities and so on.
- Look for an internship or a summer job that might be related to your career interest.

June

- Register with NCAA if you considering playing college sports. www.eligibilitycenter.org
- Take the SAT and/or ACT exams, if you did not take them last month.
- If possible, save money from your summer job to pay for upcoming college expenses, such as application fees. Application fees average \$70-90.
