# What is Dual Enrollment?

- Comes from new California State legislation AB 288:  
*“AB 288 College and Career Access Pathways Act to allow high school students, especially those in underserved communities, greater access to college courses and career tech classes at both high school and college campuses.”*
- Norco College and CNUSD have an agreement for students to take Norco College classes that will be taught at Santiago High School in the afternoon.
- Differs from our current program of concurrent enrollment which has a seat number and GPA limitations.

# Santiago High School & Norco College Partnership Goals

- Intro to and prep for college life
- Smoother transition from high school to college
- Ability to explore interests, careers, & majors
- Opportunity to address skill gaps
- Motivation to persist and pursue a postsecondary credential or degree
- Confidence in one's academic ability
- Understanding the benefits of postsecondary education
- Accelerated pathway through college that can **save time & money**



# Dual Enrollment: Research California

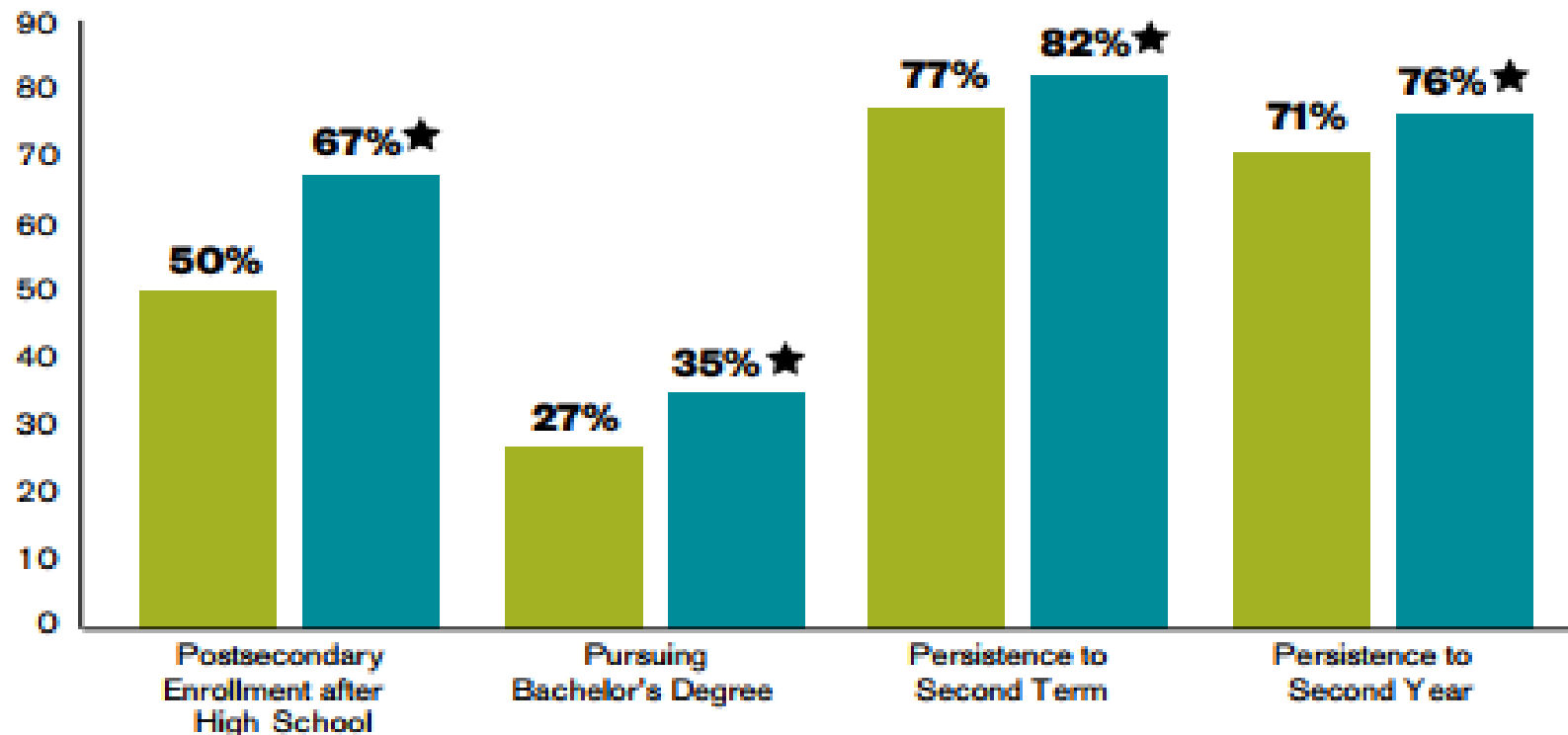
- Study (2008-2011) involving 3,000 students enrolled in career-focused Dual Enrollment courses at 8 sites across California.
- Participating students – compared to similar students not enrolled in Dual Enrollment - overall, had better academic outcomes:
  - More likely to graduate from high school
  - More likely to transition to a 4-year college
  - More likely to persist in postsecondary education
  - Less likely to take basic skills courses in college
  - Accumulate more college credits

# Dual Enrollment Benefits

1. No cost to you: All courses are FREE! Includes all related fees and textbooks
2. College instructors: Norco College faculty or Santiago HS teachers that are adjunct faculty
3. Earn college units & High School graduation credit without having to pass an AP exam
4. College to college credit for transfer to UC/CSU's and community colleges
5. Courses are taught on Santiago HS campus. No need for students to be concerned with transportation to college campus
6. Santiago HS students are supported through the process of the college application, registration and throughout the year
7. Students have the opportunity to take 15 units per semester (up to 4 classes max) at Norco College

# ILA-3 Student Resiliency

- ALL DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS MUST TAKE THIS COURSE
- Course Description:
  - This participatory course trains students how to attain, foster, and utilize skills that may support academic success in the face of adversity. The course includes theories of resiliency, workshops on strategies for resilience and academic success, problem-solving applications, and network building.

- Norco College Finals are December 9<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup>, 2019

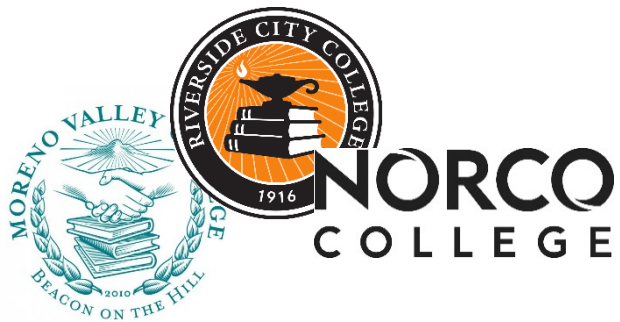
## **Spring Semester 2020**

- Norco College Spring Break = April 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020
- Norco College Finals are June 8<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020
- CNUSD Finals are June 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020

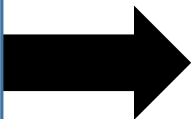
# Considerations

- Classes through Dual Enrollment are **College** courses. A “D” or “F” or “W” (Withdraw) grade are permanently reflected on the student’s college transcript and the student may be placed on academic probation at the college level plus financial aid.
- Students are expected to attend classes, even if CNUSD is not in session.
- Students are expected to complete rigorous course work, which may impact time available for extracurricular activities.
- If you already have a busy and/or impacted schedule, the additional requirements of a dual enrollment program could cause grades to suffer and defeat the benefits of dual enrollment.
- Poor grades can also impact CIF and NCAA eligibility.
- Students must be mentally, emotionally and academically prepared and ready for college rigor.
- Santiago HS students enrolled in the Dual Enrollment program are COLLEGE STUDENTS. Students must act on their own behalf and instructors only communicate with the student.

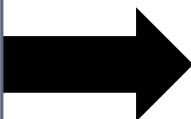
